

# CLIMATE / SEASON

The harvest began later than usual, due to late, cold winter conditions and a cooler spring. But once the warmer February came, it accelerated, and everything practically ripened in a space of 3 weeks.



#### WINEMAKING & VINIFICATION

For many years Cinsault was the step child of the South African wine industry. Being one of the parents of Pinotage, the cultivar was neglected and never had the chance to show its potential. I was fortunate enough to find this beautiful Old Vine Cinsault on a farm just outside of Darling. This block was so well looked after and never cropped. When we got the opportunity to use these grapes that were previously sold top co-ops for blending, we were astounded by what they could produce.

- The secret of this block is the pick date regular visits to the vineyard, tasting the grapes and understand the correct day to pick
- Picked in small crates and left overnight in a cold room to bring the temp to 10 deg Celsius
- The challenge is understanding the current vintage conditions to balance whole bunch, destemming and adding stalks (tannin)
- A combination of whole bunch, destemmed grapes and stalks go into a stainlesssteel tank and are left until natural ferment starts
- One to two soft pump overs per day, it was left for 2 weeks, pressed and transferred into older 225I French oak barrels (min oxidation during the process)
- Barrel aging for 12 15 months

This wine was released in 2015 and because of minimal interference and no additions, except for some sulphites, this classic wine has the potential to age for 30+ years.
